

WHAT IS ECO SCHOOLS?



Eco Schools is an international programme designed to help schools, colleges and nurseries become as 'green' and sustainable as possible. The idea of Eco Schools is that the programme is led by young people and that they work with staff and others through the means of an Eco Committee. At Blackpool Sixth, we also have the Eco Action enrichment group which works on practical environmental action and links closely with the Eco Committee.

WHAT HAVE WE DONE AT BLACKPOOL SIXTH IN 2024-25?

- Carried out an environmental review of the college covering the 10 Eco Schools topics.
- Developed an action plan with projects focused on three topics: Biodiversity, Marine and Healthy Living.
- Run the 'Cut Your Carbon' campaign in November 2024 with the whole college community. We logged an amazing 431 carbon-cutting actions by students and staff. We ran an inter-PM group competition to see who could carry out the most actions.
- We have planted a further 400 trees in the college grounds, including creating a new mini-woodland area. We have planted over 1500 trees in the past 5 years.
- We cut the college's energy consumption electricity down 6% (Sept Jan) and gas down by 15% (Sept May), substantially reducing our carbon footprint.
- We continued to promote our '5 A Day for the Environment' Eco Code.
- We organised and hosted the first ever Lancashire Youth Climate Conference and had 98 attendees from 17 schools/colleges/youth groups.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS



BIODIVERSITY

- New mini-woodland area created
- Nest boxes installed and used by birds
- Long grass and wildflower areas created
- Became a release site for rescued hedgehogs
- Roe deer seen in college grounds for the first time



Research by our A Level
Biology students showed
that the long-grass areas
we had created were 3
times more plant species
diverse, with an average of
7 species per square metre
compared to 2 in the mown
areas.



MARINE

- We held a 'Love Our Oceans Week' in college, featuring fundraising for a marine protection charity (£315 raised) and an 'Oceans Fair' with stalls from organisations offering volunteering and career opportunities
- We encouraged students and staff to cut their use of singleuse plastics



HEALTHY LIVING

- We promoted 'active travel' and swapping meat for plantbased days as part of our 'Cut Your Carbon' month in November 2024
- We held 'wellbeing' planting and nature-connection sessions for students
- We grew our own fruit, vegetables and herbs and shared the produce

SUSTAINABILITY IN THE CURRICULUM



A key part of our Eco Schools work is helping to ensure that sustainability and environmental topics are covered in the college's curriculum. Here are some examples:



As part of the national Eco Schools 'Cut Your Carbon' week, Pastoral Mentor groups learnt about how individuals and families can take effective action to cut their carbon footprints.



BTEC Level 2 Personal Growth and Wellbeing students planted trees in college and did a litter pick as part of their community-focused module.

A Level Environmental Science students visited ENVECO in Blackpool to take part in a consultation on the new food waste regulations and to learn about how the area deals with its waste and recycling.

We are applying to maintain our Green Flag award to recognise the progress we have made together this year. Our Eco Schools Committee will soon look at what our key projects should be for 2025-26. We want your ideas to help us shape those plans.









We are looking for more students and staff to join our Eco Committee and Eco Action group and help us make next year our greenest yet!



Current and former members of our Eco Committee have now set up a Lancashire wide climate action group for 16-25 year olds, as part of the Lancashire Climate Action Network.
